We joined them Saturday late afternoon for food, fellowship, worship and Bible teaching together. It was a mix of English and French so we were able to communicate. Best of all, I was able to meet some of the church members and began making relationships. I met Annie, a Parisian who has assisted

Then a couple days later, we went to Pastor Mike and Becky's home for a great lunch, some discussion and prayer. For my first year in Paris, I will be focusing on language school, assisting with the Sunday school for the younger kids, shadowing Becky as she leads a Bible study and reaching out to others at the language school. It might not seem like a lot but language classes are 20 hours a week Monday – Friday for at least 12 weeks (not counting home work). Please pray that I will be able to pick up this language that I love and not let pride get in the way.

Speaking of school, I just finished my last **PERSPECTIVES** class! It's a 15-week long course focused on different aspects of missions and spreading the Gospel. My church in FL sponsored a course and it was a great learning experience with many insights!

In addition, I'm in the middle of my Master's course on Christian History and thoroughly enjoying it! It's massive amounts of reading but what great witnesses have gone before us. Soon I will be going to Seattle for my week-long in-class session.



Food Drive

Since I have to spend so much of my time reading (and wasn't able to find part-time work) I wanted to have the opportunity to interact with people and share the Word when possible. So I began volunteering at the downtown St. Petersburg Free Clinic (SPFC) where I assist with the in-take process. SPFC serves the poor by offering a medical clinic, social services, and it has a very large food bank. The Post Office recently did a **Food Drive** and all of the County's donations went to SPFC. I helped with that activity and was blessed to learn more donations came in than the previous year, almost 11 tons of food.

All seems to be moving forward, though the funds are moving slowly. Please pray for monthly financial partners (of any amount) to
